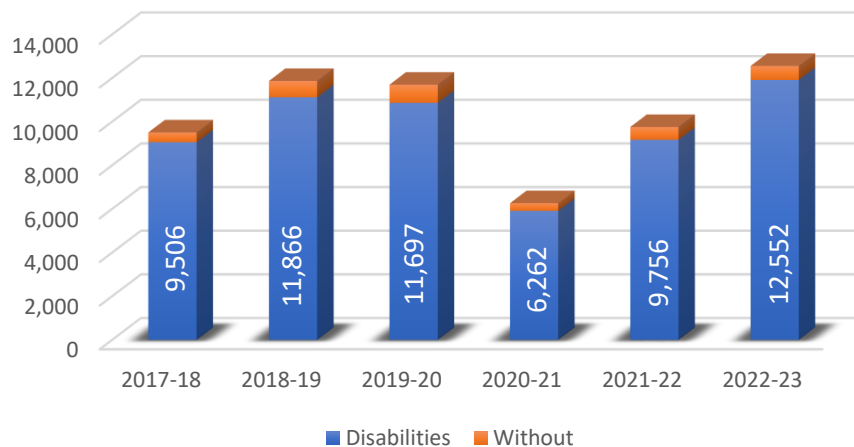
Highest on Record!

Michigan schools reported using seclusion
12,552 Times
during the 2022-23 school year.

That's
Up 28.7%
from 9,756 last school year.

94.9%
of reported seclusions are
used on students
with disabilities.

Seclusion in Michigan Schools



Seclusion was used an average of
70 Times a day in Michigan
Considering about 180 days make up a school year.

This is despite the statement by the U.S. Department of Education that "Every effort should be made to
Prevent
the need for the use of restraint and for the use of seclusion." "There is
No Evidence
that using restraint or seclusion is effective in reducing the occurrence of the problem behaviors that frequently precipitate the use of such techniques."
